We welcomed Kevin Bielicki to our monthly PBS meeting in January. Mr. Bielicki is currently the curator of the bonsai collection at Longwood Gardens. He started his career in bonsai at the Kennett Collection, a private collection of bonsai trees. He had no formal apprenticeship, but worked his way up from landscaping to working on the collection, learning from many bonsai masters invited to work on the Kennett Collection.

Mr. Bielicki shared some of the history of bonsai at Longwood. The collection began in 1959 with the donation of 13 trees from Yuji Yoshimura. Of those, 4 still remain in the collection.

Until 1975, bonsai trees were displayed in popup locations around Longwood, and in 1975, the collection was given its permanent home in the East Conservatory passageway where it resided until late last year.

The vision for the bonsai collection as part of Longwood Reimagined involves moving the bonsai collection from its current location to its own courtyard. The courtyard will contain hedges and seating for an improved visitor experience. The space will have the capacity to house 40-60 trees, and there are plans to rotate the collection several times a year. The new collection will include 50 specimens donated by the Kennett Collection.



Looking to the future, the bonsai exhibit will reopen later this year in the Oct-Nov timeframe. In 2026, we can look forward to an azalea bonsai exhibit. Patience is definitely key in this hobby!
